DCAN AGM - 28 May at 19:00 online



Nature recovery: Land use consultation:

It's a vital summer of public consultation on land use in Dorset. Look out

- Dorset Council's draft Local Nature Recovery Strategy is due to be launched on 7th May with a 12-week consultation period to the end of July.
- The Government's Defra consultation on a Land Use Framework for England has now closed with results due to be published in August. Dorset Council claimed it would be submitting its own comments on the framework by the 25th April deadline with a covering letter from Nick Ireland but it has not so far made those comments or the letter public on its website. DCAN did not make a separate response but several members of DCAN were involved in CPRE's response. You can read this here.
- The next stage of Dorset Council's public consultation on its longdelayed Local Plan launches in August.

The three documents need to dovetail to make any proper sense so close monitoring and scrutiny is required by all.

Advocacy Team Update

DCAN responded to Dorset Council's report on "Revised Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Trajectories and Key Milestones" with a question to a Full Council meeting on 4th April. We complimented their revised net zero targets (2035 for council, 2045 for county) but suggested that there was a lot more that Dorset Council could be doing especially with the county targets. The response from Nick Ireland (leader of Dorset Council) has been very positive and we are organising a follow up meeting with Nick and the council officers.

Do It ?" It will be a Zoom Webinar at 18.30 on 4th June. This looks like being a very interesting event with representation from universities, architects, builders and developers. More information available on the Dorset CPRE web site (link above). Dorset Council's consultation on the Local Plan is expected for 8 weeks starting on 18 August. Consultation on the new Local Transport Plan (LTP4) is expected at the same time and there will be a joint roadshow around Dorset.
