

### **Editorial Comment**

#### **Extreme Weather in 2025**

This year has seen new weather records in UK with baselines shifting - hottest temperatures, lowest rainfall, severe flooding, failed crops. Most people tend to file these events as unusual hot/wet/cold/windy spells in an unpredictable weather system. Yet worldwide events - floods in Texas and Pakistan, extreme temperatures in Iran and China, forest fires in France, Turkey and Greece, heat waves in Europe etc. barely make the news in the UK, and so do not impinge on many peoples' consciousness. Climate change is with us now, but the 'boiling frog' effect allows people to ignore

While the work that DCAN does in restoring hedgerows, improving the efficiency of homes, cleaning up rivers and beaches, promoting renewable energy, reducing waste and working with Dorset Council to tackle climate change and loss of biodiversity is essential, the task of increasing awareness falls to our Carbon Literacy program and the Dorset COP in November. We would welcome your ideas of how to reach a wider base, particularly with younger people.

#### Key Tasks would include:

- Access the Dorset CAN bank account. Receive receipts and set up payments.
- Regularly update the bookkeeping system ensuring funds are allocated to the appropriate project.
- Prepare monthly Income and Expenditure statements, balance sheets and cash flow reports
- Ensure compliance with Charities Commission regulations
- Manage data integrity and documentation. Ensure data is correct and improve data entry processes and controls.
- Assist with the preparation of Year End returns (creditors, debtors prepayments and deferred income)
- Process Gift Aid claims

The role would be flexible, working from home and on a voluntary basis.
