Editorial

I am finding it all too easy to fall into the rabbit hole of anger and depression at the criminal, corrupt, hateful and wilfully blind leadership of the US, Russia, Israel and other countries.

However on the plus side, Operation Epic Fury will severely disrupt the oil economy, which may accelerate progress to more sustainable technology. The move to renewables is 'beyond our wildest dreams' (Fateh Birol, director of the IEA). Over 50% of the UK's electricity came from renewables in 2024; the price of solar panels has dropped 99.3% since 1975 and battery storage by 93% since 2010. Access to these technologies is increasingly widespread, a bottom-up democratic shift to small scale with villages all over the world able to install electricity for lighting and refrigeration.

The opening of UK's first geothermal plant in Cornwall will produce not only 3GW of electricity but potentially up to 2000 tonnes of Lithium per year.

Other cheering news can be found in 'Our World in Data' website. Cheap energy for all and the future decline of the petrostates is something to look forward to.



Community Energy Projects

DCAN and Dorset Community Energy have been successful in our bid for £40,000 from the Great British Energy-Community Energy Fund. The award is for a feasibility study for a community-owned windfarm North of Dorchester. The project is due to start in April and will take 6 months to complete.

Meanwhile the Feasibility study for the Loders Community Project is under way also funded by the CEF. The purpose is to decarbonise local areas and reduce the bills especially for poorer households.

DEFRA Starts Consultation on Beach Designation

DEFRA has agreed the West Bay Swimmer's application for East Beach in West Bay near Bridport as one of 13 locations in England to go to public consultation on its designation as a bathing beach.


A similar campaign was successfully conducted for Church Cliff Beach in Lyme Regis in 2024 by the River Lim Action Group. Vicki Elcoate, from the action group, said: "it's a lever to secure better water quality and the pressure is now on South West Water and the Environment Agency to find a solution to our pollution problems."
