Campaigning

Dorset CAN has signed a letter to the President and members of the European Commission and environment ministers, calling for a Moratorium on new waste incineration in the EU. This is following the rejection of the planning application of the proposed Portland Incinerator, and the subsequent reversal by government ministers. Permission has been granted for a Court of Appeal hearing against the government decision.

Plan for a major Oil Well south of Dorchester

Egdon Resources want to resume their previous plans for new oil wells and extraction of 138,000 tonnes of oil by 2033 at Waddock Cross. This will result in a big increase in Greenhouse Gas emission.

Dorset CAN opposes new fossil fuel wells, which are incompatible with plans to reach net zero by 2050. Vicki Elcoate, a Dorset CAN Trustee, is calling for members to object to the planning application. See her letter here.

Shaftesbury seeks national recognition for its Nature Friendly Town

Shaftesbury is hoping its pioneering plan to be declared a <u>Nature Friendly Town</u> - expanding its earlier declaration as an Orchard Town - will be taken up at the national '<u>Creating Nature Neighbourhood Towns and Cities</u>' conference in Manchester on 23 October.

Dorset Wildlife Trust and the Dorset office of the National Trust have both offered to support the concept at the one-day in-person conference - for people from voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations to 'explore the vital role that nature can play in building happier, healthier and more connected urban communities.'
